

INTRODUCTION

This booklet serves as a resource for members of The Riverside Church as well as non-members who are interested in scheduling a funeral or memorial service. It is also designed to answer some basic questions and provide resource information that will be helpful in planning a meaningful service.

It is our hope and prayer that we will help to lighten the burden and provide comfort through the challenging experience of arranging the funeral or memorial of a loved one. We prayerfully achieve this through a staff of well-trained pastors who, through their care and sensitivity, help provide guidance through the journey of loss.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT

The Riverside Church holds funeral and memorial services for members, immediate family and friends of our faith community. We hold services in both the Nave and Christ Chapel, and offer spaces for repast gatherings. When a death has occurred, or is imminent, one of our ordained Riverside ministers will be assigned to that family to provide pastoral care. The minister will meet with family members, pray with them, and guide them in planning a meaningful service. The Director of Music assists families with music selections and the hire of soloists, if desired. Riverside clergy may also travel with the family to the final committal, when requested.

The Coordinator of Pastoral Events is available to assist with the non-liturgical details of planning a service including: identifying and scheduling spaces for repast events, providing referrals for funeral homes, cremation services, florists, and caterers.

OUR POLICY & PRACTICE

The Riverside Church clergy will preside as officiants for funerals and memorials held at the church. The request for the participation of a former Riverside minister in a memorial or funeral service shall come at the invitation of the current Senior Minister.

PRE-PLANNING

When a death occurs, family and loved ones are required to make a myriad of decisions at one of the most stressful times in their lives. Pre-planning a funeral or memorial allows you to make your wishes known with clarity, and can alleviate a great deal of stress for your loved ones. You may contact the Coordinator of Pastoral Events or the Parish Care office for information on pre-planning a funeral or memorial. An ordained Riverside Minister will meet with you and your family and prayerfully assist in crafting a meaningful service; complete with scriptures and music selections.

The Memorial Society of The Riverside Church provides counsel and advice to members of the church and the surrounding community about practical end-of-life issues. Under the supervision of the Parish Care Ministry, the Memorial Society volunteers offer assistance in the following areas:

- Provide materials for persons to express their wishes in writing, regarding their bodily remains after death, health care proxies and living wills, and organ donation.
- Provide information about funerals, memorial services, cremation, interment, and burial options in the New York metropolitan area.
- Assist church members and their immediate family in purchasing niches in the Columbarium of The Riverside Church, the receiving vault of ashes of the dead, located in South Hall lobby.

FUNERAL VS. MEMORIAL

While it is not uncommon for people to use the terms "funeral" and "memorial" interchangeably, these are actually two different options.

A funeral service is a formal service of worship in which the casketed body of the deceased is present. It is the practice of The Riverside Church to close the casket after the final viewing. Once the casket has been closed, it remains closed and will not be re-opened. Typically, a graveside service immediately follows a funeral.

A memorial service is a formal service of worship that takes place without the casketed body being present. It is a common practice to have an urn with the cremated remains or ashes accompanied with a photo to serve as a replacement for a casket, but this is a matter of preference. Some families chose to have the simplicity of a candle and/or photo of their loved one.

When attempting to make a decision between a funeral or memorial, it is often helpful to understand that funerals are typically time sensitive and do not always afford the opportunity to plan out all the details one might like to have incorporated in the service. Memorials are not time sensitive and may take place whenever a family feels prepared to arrange a service with the Coordinator of Pastoral Events. Additionally, costs related to funeral services are often considerably higher than memorial services.

MEMORIAL GATHERING

Riverside Church also makes it possible for families and friends to host a Memorial Gathering, which is not to be mistaken for the Memorial Service referenced above. The distinction between a Memorial Service and Memorial Gathering can best be described by the non-religious nature. Memorial Gatherings are typically more secular in nature and do not require the presence of Riverside Clergy. These gatherings do not take place in any of the chapel spaces and are designed to provide family and friends with a space to share remembrances and celebrate the life of the deceased.

WHEN PLANNING A MEANINGFUL SERVICE:

All funerals and memorials at The Riverside Church are services of worship that witness to the Resurrection of Jesus. As such, the service ought to be consistent with the spirit of the Christian faith and the mission and Ministry of The Riverside Church.

- While all services are understood to be celebrations of the life being remembered, we always recognize that this person is now sharing in Jesus' resurrection.
- Extravagance and material display should be avoided. An elaborate and
 expensive casket is unnecessary, since our Creator intended that the human
 body should return to the elements from which it came. A show of pride in
 material things is inconsistent with the Christian emphasis on the living spirit.
- Viewing the remains in an open casket during the funeral service has no support in scripture or Christian tradition. The use of a pall to cover the casket throughout the service signifies that before God all of us are equal and that God does not regard our loved ones according to the amount of money spent on these rites.
- While many of the members of The Riverside Church may prefer committing
 the body to the ground, there are a growing number of people who feel that
 cremation offers a number of aesthetic and practical advantages. The Riverside
 Church supports the personal decision of the member.



Sample Outline for a Funeral or Memorial Service

This is a sample outline for a Funeral/Memorial Service at The Riverside Church; it can be varied, with more or less content, or a different order of events. The places marked for hymns/music tend to work as good points of transition, and for "breaking up" the service, but this can be varied according to the content and pace of the service and the amount of music desired. It is the policy of The Riverside Church that the church's Director of Music must approve all music.

MUSICAL PRELUDE (usually by church organist)

PROCESSION (OPTIONAL)

OPENING SENTENCES & INVOCATION

(by minister, usually from scripture)

HYMN or other musical selection

READING/S from scripture and/or other sources meaningful to the deceased

SILENT READING OF OBITUARY (OPTIONAL)

WORDS OF REMEMBRANCE

(This may include reflection or remarks prepared by family members and friends) (OPTIONAL)

HYMN or other musical selection e.g. Solo

SCRIPTURE

HOMILY or EULOGY

PRAYERS OF THANKSGIVING (minister)

LORD'S PRAYER (unison)

HYMN or other musical selection (OPTIONAL)

BENEDICTION (minister)

MUSICAL POSTLUDE (usually by church organist)

AFTER THE FUNERAL OR MEMORIAL: GRIEF & BEREAVEMENT

3 Important things to remember about grief

- Everyone grieves differently: Despite what others may say, no one knows
 exactly how you feel. While grief is a natural occurrence that we all experience
 in our lifetime, the grieving process is different for everyone. What you are
 feeling is unique to you. Be gentle with yourself. There is no defined way that
 you should be feeling at any particular time.
- There is no timetable for grief: How quickly you start to feel like your old self will depend on many factors. Some people bounce back quickly while others need more time. If you feel uncomfortable with how long it is taking you to recover, consider seeking help. Riverside clergy, support groups, and professional grief counselors are some available resources.
- You are not alone: Spending time with those who care about you can offer comfort. Seek out friends and family who will understand what you are going through. Remember that your Riverside Church family is here to support you through your season of grief as well as the seasons that follow.



Grief is a natural reaction to the loss we experience when someone we love or care about dies. As painful and difficult as it is, the grieving process is an important step in healing. Readjusting to a new reality and healing may take time but here are some suggestions to help:

- Don't rush yourself: Working through grief takes time. While you may be anxious for things to return to normal, you should give yourself time to mourn.
- Stay connected: Spend time with friends and family. Being around people
 who care about you and that you care about can help. Try to resist the urge to
 isolate yourself. If you are retired or have time available, seek out volunteer
 opportunities that feel meaningful. While it can be comforting to be around
 others who are experiencing similar feelings and grief, be sure to balance your
 time with others who are not grieving.
- Get help if you feel you need it: Sadness is perfectly normal, but if you feel
 you cannot attend to your normal activities or you are worried that you are not
 coping well, reach out. Speak with Riverside clergy, friends or family members,
 consult with your doctor, and contact a support group or one of the resources
 listed.
