The Rev. Dr. Harkins serves as Director of Interfaith Outreach for The Democratic National Committee, where he coordinates all of the party's engagement with faith communities and faith leaders.

From 2015 to 2020 he served as Senior Vice President for Innovation in Public Programs at Union Theological Seminary in New York City. From 1997 to 2015 Dr. Harkins was the Senior Minister of the Nineteenth

Street Baptist Church in Washington, DC., where he led the congregation in initiatives ranging from community development, providing health education and access, as well as international relief and development in Rwanda, Burkina Faso, and Jamaica.

Before beginning his pastorate at Nineteenth Street, he served as the Senior Minister of the New Hope Baptist Church of Dallas Texas. There he also served as President of the Greater Dallas Community of Churches and was a founding board member of The Dallas Leadership Foundation. His ministerial career began at the Historic Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem, New York where he was a seminarian intern before becoming Assistant Minister. Dr. Harkins has been a guest lecturer on the church and social action at a number of colleges and universities including, Rutgers, Cornell, Iona College, and Harvard's Kennedy School of Government.

Dr. Harkins was a contributing author for The Audacity of Faith: Christian Leaders Reflect on the Election of Barack Obama (Judson Press). He is also the Chair of the Board of Odyssev Impact Productions, whose film, Newtown, was the winner of a 2018 Peabody Award. Their production Notes from Dunblane: Lessons from a School Shooting was awarded best documentary short at the 2018 Tribeca Film Festival. In addition, he is an Executive Producer of the widely acclaimed documentary. The Rape of Recy Taylor, and also the upcoming documentary, A Crime on the Bayou. An active voice on a range of issues including racial justice, economic equity, and immigration reform, he has appeared on a number of media outlets, including CNN, MSNBC, Fox News, and NPR. He has also served on the Boards of Sojourners, Faith in Public Life, and World Relief. He has earned a B.S. degree in Broadcasting and Film, from Boston University, a Master of Divinity degree in Church History from Union Theological Seminary, NY, and a Doctorate in Homiletics as a Proctor Booth Fellow from United Seminary, in Dayton, Ohio. He and his wife Juli, a healthcare grants administrator, are the parents of two daughters Lauren and Shannon.

Featured on the cover left to right:

Judith Heumann Disability rights activist, successfully sued the Board of Education on the basis of discrimination, and became the first wheelchair user to teach in New York City.

Ida B. Wells-Barnett Black investigative journalist, educator, an early leader in the civil rights movement, and one of the founders of the NAACP.

Malala Yousafzai Pakistani activist for female education and the youngest Nobel Prize laureate. Known for human rights advocacy, especially the education of women and children in Pakistan.

Shirley Chisholm First African-American woman elected to the U.S. Congress and first African-American candidate for a major party's nomination for President of the United States.

Sylvia Rivera Latina American gay liberation and transgender rights activist, and co-founder of the Street Transvestite Action Revolutionaries (STAR) with Marsha P. Johnson.

Marsha P. Johnson Gay liberation activist, an outspoken advocate for gay rights, and one of the prominent figures in the Stonewall uprising of 1969.

Kamala Harris United States senator from California, and the first African American, the first Asian American, and the third female vice presidential running mate on a major party ticket.

Ruth Bader Ginsburg Justice of the Supreme Court of the United State, advocate for gender equality and women's rights, and co-founder of the Women's Rights Project at the ACLU.

Rachel Held Evans Progressive Christian columnist and author, writing about faith, doubt and life in the Bible Belt.

Dolores Huerta Labor leader and civil rights activist and co-founder of the National Farmworkers Association, later known as United Farm Workers (UFW).

Marian Wright Edelman Activist for children's rights, and advocate for disadvantaged Americans. Founder and president emerita of the Children's Defense Fund.
