Chanequa Walker-Barnes, Ph.D., is a licensed clinical psychologist, public theologian, and ecumenical minister whose work focuses upon identifying and healing the individual and societal legacies of racial and gender oppression. She is the author of *Too Heavy a Yoke: Black Women and the Burden of Strength* (2014) and *I Bring the Voices of My People: A Womanist Vision for Racial Reconciliation* (2019). Beyond the classroom, Dr. Chanequa spends most of her professional energy writing and ministering to clergy and

faith-based activists. Her faith has been shaped by Methodist, Baptist, and evangelical social justice communities as well as by Buddhism and Islam. She was ordained by an independent fellowship that holds incarnational theology, community engagement, social justice, and prophetic witness as its core values. She has recently been appointed as Professor of Practical Theology and Pastoral Care at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta, Georgia.
