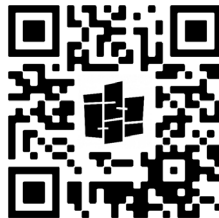

CHURCH NURSERY

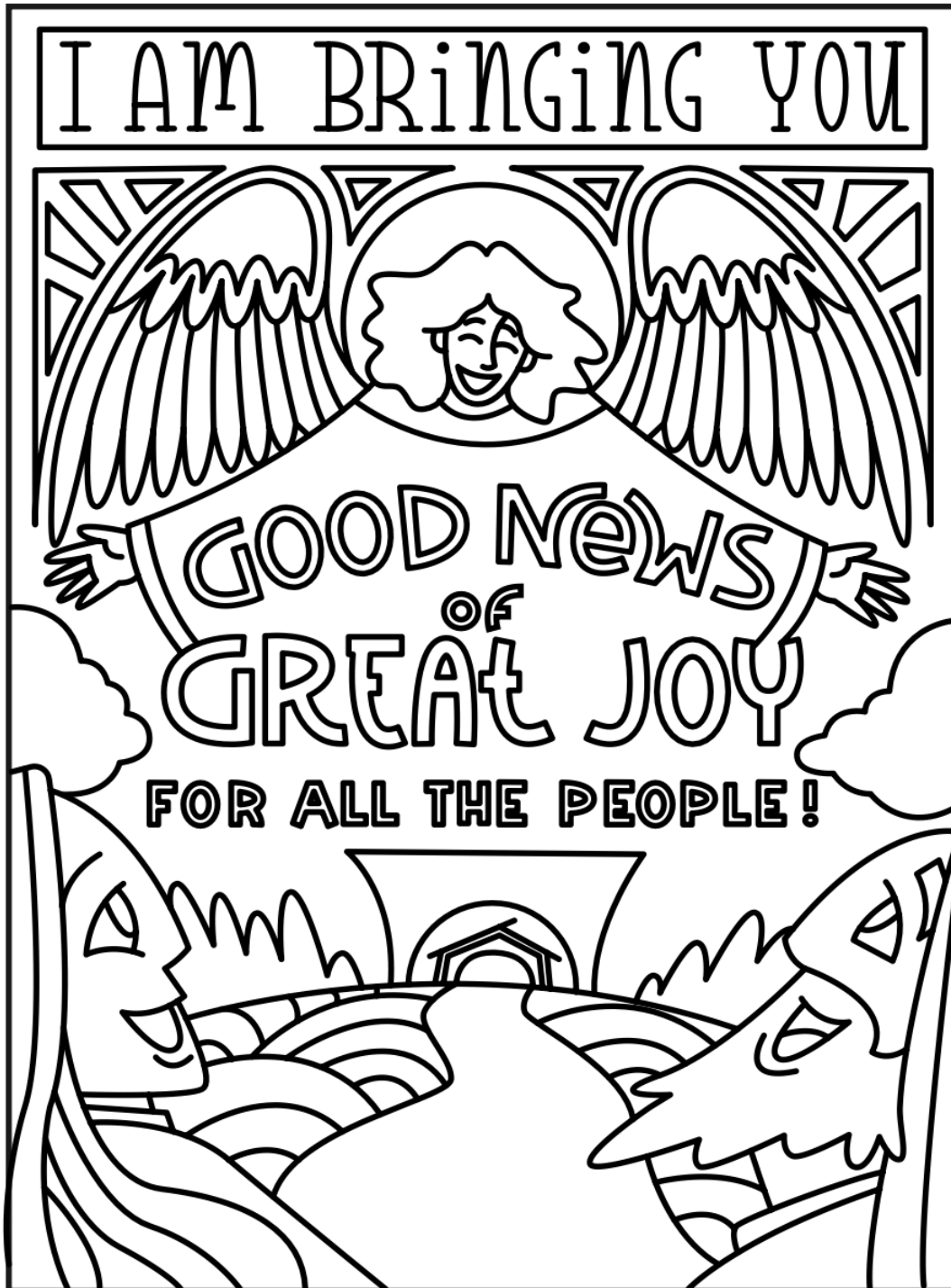
