



Rev. Karlos Nichols, M.Ed., M.A. (he/him/his) is an ordained minister, educator, and community organizer from Memphis, TN, who works with organizations to create spaces for reimagination that lead to the flourishing of all persons. Karlos's research interrogates the interdependence of religion, education, and policy in the lives of Black children. His philosophy is "education and religious influence serve as an inescapable grounding for all policies that impact the lives of Black children." He is an advocate for children's autonomy and pedagogical liberation for Black students. Karlos believes that the liberation of children from oppressive systems and structures should be paramount to the communal understanding of justice and equity. Karlos is an ordained minister and has served in multiple capacities such as Associate Pastor, Minister of Worship and Arts, Children, Student, and Youth Pastor.


Karlos holds a Bachelor's Degree in Musical Theatre and Urban Studies from The New School University, a Master's in Education from Walden University, a Master's Degree in Homiletics and Worship from Union Theological Seminary at Columbia University in the City of New York, and is a Doctoral Candidate in K-12 Leadership at Delaware State University. He is a proud member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. serving as the Recording Secretary for District IV.

Karlos has experience as an educator, administrator, and fundraiser for multiple organizations over his 20-year career in non-profit administration. In 2015, Karlos launched Memphis, TN's largest public elementary school dance and theatre program which continues serves over 600 students weekly. He continues to consult K-12 schools and universities on curriculum design and program implementation for inclusive pedagogical practices. Some of his consultations have included Duke University, Shelby County Schools, and the Young Actors Guild.

Karlos is the Director for the iROCK Young Adult Collective of The National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. where he engages with the over 3 million members of the organization in an effort to reimagine and develop programming that centers the lived experiences of 18-40 year olds. Karlos is the inaugural Rook Chapel Gospel Fellow at Bucknell University. He recently served as the Youth Leadership and Advocacy Associate at The Children's Defense Fund-New York.

Karlos is a two-time Billboard Top 40 Gospel Debut charting artist. His first project "Live in Memphis: Hope" remained on the airplay charts for more than two years. In 2019, in partnership with IndieBlu music (part of Entertainment One), Karlos released his second project "Be Alright" on all digital media outlets, which debuted in the top 20 iTunes sales and received over 30,000 streams within the first three months. Karlos's latest EP- "Something Within" was released in December 2023 under his independent label The Kane Group.

Karlos is a son of the Christ Missionary Baptist Church in Memphis, TN under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Gina M. Stewart in Memphis. He currently holds dual membership at both Shiloh Baptist Church-Plainfield, NJ under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Danielle L. Brown in Plainfield, NJ and Metropolitan Baptist Church- DMV in Largo, MD under the leadership of Rev. Dr. George L. Parks.
