This performance is dedicated to honoring the exceptional voice and enduring legacy of a truly remarkable individual. Today's concert, featuring Russell Saint John as the Baritone and Douglas Blake as the Accompanist, is a fitting tribute to the unforgettable rendition of Negro Spirituals and Folk Songs by Paul Robeson at The Salle Gaveau Concert Hall in Rue de la Boétie, Paris, France, on October 29, 1927, at 9 p.m. This event also commemorates the Quasquicentennial Year (125th) of his birth on April 9, 1898.

Paul Robeson was not only an extraordinary artist but also a dedicated humanitarian. He recognized his talents as gifts from a higher power and, driven by his faith, he continued to share his abilities despite facing persecution and oppression. Despite enduring the hardships imposed upon him due to his unwavering commitment to democracy, he remained steadfast in his tireless advocacy for the rights of marginalized communities.

We express our deepest gratitude to Paul Leroy Robeson for his artistic contributions and relentless pursuit of civil liberties. His spirit endures, and we are committed to ensuring that his influence on the journey towards a better world is never forgotten.

About the Artists



Described as possessing... "an assured, soothing baritone" by John Perelas, of the New York Times, **Russell Saint John'**s lyric voice and compelling interpretations of the solo, operatic and oratorical repertoire have brought him critical acclaim in the United States and Europe.

He has worked with some of the great conductors of our day including Zubin Mehta, Andrew Litton, Willie Waters, John DeMain, David Gilbert, Julius Williams, and James Levine of the Metropolitan Opera. He has also been featured in recitals and as soloist with orchestras in many international music festivals including Il Gran Teatro La Fenice, Théâtre du Châtelet, the Ruins of Pompeii Festival in Sicily and the Salzburg Festival in Austria.

His large repertoire is diverse, ranging from Lieder, Art Songs and Spirituals to the great oratorical and major concert works of Bach, Handel, Mozart, and Mendelsshohn. Operatic roles include DiLuna in *Il Trovatore* (Verdi), Rodrigo in *Don Carlo* (Verdi), Amonasro in *Aida* (Verdi).

A major exponent of new music, he actively performs the works of living composers and has given the world premieres of *Death* by Luis Andrei Cobo, and The Dance Theaterformen Harlem's 'Spiritual Suite' composed by Tonia León, narrated by Levar Burton and the legendary Marion Anderson.

Mr. Saint John has been fortunate enough to have worked with Betty Allen, Kathleen Battle, Jessye Norman and Grace Bumbry.

We look forward to sharing the music from this historical event which was performed 97 years ago at the Salle Gaveau, in Paris, France.

Douglas Drake is currently Music Director Emeritus of Broadway United Church of Christ in New York City. As chapel organist for St. Hilda's & St. Hugh's School, he plays daily chapel services for students and faculty, and he also serves as organist at Eighth Church of Christ, Scientist, Mr. Drake was also associate musician at St. Michael's Church, Manhattan, for ten years, where he helped to organize and perform in a series of all-Bach recitals on the church's famous Rudolf von Beckerath organ. It was on that occasion that the New York Times commented upon his "lucid touch." Mr. Drake has performed in Merkin Concert Hall and a variety of New York City's houses of worship. A graduate of the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati, he studied organ with David Mulbury.
