

The Riverside Church Millennial Scholarship Program offers youth involved in the ministry programs of the church scholarships to accredited colleges, universities and vocational programs. Annually the congregation gives several scholarships to eligible youth. These scholarships can be dispersed out over the course of one or four academic years. Since its inception the Millennial Scholarship program has dispersed more than \$400,000 to youth involved in our ministry programs.

#### The Carl A. Fields Scholarship Award

\$15,000 College Scholarship

This award is a testament to Dr. Carl A. Fields Sr., who was known for his untiring dedication to youth, education, building bridges between communities and a considerable commitment to the lay leadership of the Riverside Church. Dr. Fields was one of the first African-American Deans of Princeton University and was one of the founding members of the Rites of Passage Program at The Riverside Church.

### The Millicent Wiley Award

\$10,000 College Scholarship

This award is a testament to Millicent Wiley who was a member of The Riverside Church congregation. In her lifetime, she had a commitment to the education of youth both here in New York and in New Jersey. Her legacy of hope is honored in the award.

## The Daniels-Lorick Award

\$5,000 College Scholarship

This award is a continuation of the history of scholarship support begun in the 1960's after the death of The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., by the Black Christian Fellowship of The Riverside Church. This award is a testimony to their efforts to provide support for youth going to college.

## 2024 Eligibility Requirements

It is our hope that our scholarship recipients are dedicated to the principles of faith and justice in our communities and will desire to sustain a relationship with Riverside Church as recipients continue to evolve into adulthood.

Acceptance of the Riverside Millennial Scholarship Award comes with a commitment of two responsibilities to strengthen leadership skills and maintain connection to your Riverside community.

- 1. Join a Riverside committee, commission or program/activity at Riverside during at least one summer during your 4-year college tenure. Riverside Ministries:
  - Social Justice
  - Social Services
  - Parish Care & Community
  - Worship
  - Faith and Formation
  - Theatre of Oppressed
- 2. Complete 25 hours of volunteer service at Riverside after graduation.

There is flexibility in this requirement depending on student academic capacity. We encourage you to pursue summer internships and maintain communication on your summer endeavors. If you are unable to return to the Tri-state area in the summer, we strongly encourage you to seek the completion of your volunteer hours at local churches and/or faith-centered organizations in your area.

The year of volunteer service hours can be completed within two years of graduation unless there are extenuating circumstances.

#### The Carl A. Fields Scholarship Award

- Must be a baptized or confirmed member of The Riverside Church for a minimum of two years.
- Graduating High School Senior
- Must be consistently active in the Children & Youth Ministries of The Riverside Church, for at least two years including current year.
- Plan to enroll in the fall at an accredited four-year college or must have been born no earlier than January 1, 1999.
- Strong consideration given to those who demonstrate financial need. Students must submit a copy of either their FAFSA Expected Family Contribution (EFC) form (these are kept extremely confidential, and are only used to assess need).
- Scholastic Achievement: GPA range for this award 3.5 and above

#### The Millicent Wiley Award

- Must be a baptized or confirmed member of The Riverside Church for a minimum of two years.
- Graduating High School Senior
- Must be consistently active in the Children & Youth Ministries of The Riverside Church, for at least two years including current year.
- Plan to enroll in the fall at an accredited college and must have been born no earlier than January 1, 1999.
- Strong consideration given to those who demonstrate financial need. Students must submit a copy of either their FAFSA Expected Family Contribution (EFC) form (these are kept extremely confidential, and are only used to assess need).
- Scholastic Achievement: Expected GPA for this award: 3.2

## The Daniels-Lorick Award

- Graduating High School Senior or G.E.D. recipient
- Must have participated in a program of Riverside Youth Ministries or the Riverside Hawks, for at least one year including current year.
- Plan to enroll in the fall at an accredited college and must have been born no earlier than January 1, 1999.
- Strong consideration given to those who demonstrate financial need. Students must submit a copy of either their FAFSA Expected Family Contribution (EFC) form (these are kept extremely confidential, and are only used to assess need).
- Scholastic Achievement: Expected GPA of 2.5 or successful completion of a G.E.D

## Frequently Asked Questions

Is the Millennial Scholarship Program for undergraduates only?

Yes, financial assistance is for undergraduate education. This includes both traditional, four-year institutions, as well as other alternate education, such as trade schools and/or community colleges.

What is the deadline for submitting applications?

The Millennial Scholarship Program requires that all materials be mailed in one packet and received by Friday, April 1st, 2024.

When can we expect to hear something back on the status of the application?

Finalists will be selected no later than April  $10^{th}$ . Applicants can expect to be notified during that time. Interviews for selected finalists will take place during the week of April  $11^{th}$  – April  $18^{th}$ , 2024 and winners notified by May  $1^{st}$ , 2023.

When are letters of recommendation and school transcripts due? Can they be sent separately from my application?

All application materials must be mailed in one packet. Please ensure your scholarship packet is complete prior to mailing or submitted via email, as incomplete, or faxed applications will not be evaluated.

Do my letters of recommendation have to be written by teachers, or can they come from anyone?

We ask for two letters of recommendation. At least one of these should be written by someone from your school, such as a teacher, guidance counselor, or principal. The second letter may be submitted by anyone who knows you well and can attest to your character, leadership ability, commitment to community service, and/or academic achievement. This can be someone you worked for, a mentor, or coach. It cannot be someone in your family, or a guardian.

Why is the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) needed to apply? Is there an income limit?

Financial need is a factor that we consider in awarding scholarships. If you think that you will be eligible for financial aid at the colleges to which you are applying, you should apply to the Millennial Scholarship Program. All financial information is used solely to assess need, and is only seen by the Minister in charge of overseeing the scholarship's administration. The Minister will simply verify need to the committee without disclosing personal information.
