






**Leonard Bopp** (guest conductor) is a conductor and trumpet player currently based in New York City. In his early career, Leonard emerged as a generous collaborator, thoughtful curator, and electric performer with a broad repertoire.

Fiercely committed to the music of our time, Leonard founded the BlackBox Ensemble, a New York-based contemporary music ensemble devoted to producing culturally resonate projects rooted in creative experimentation, while still a student. Under his leadership, BlackBox has grown into one of the most ambitious emerging ensembles in New York's contemporary music landscape.

After graduating from The Juilliard School Pre-College Division, where he studied trumpet with Raymond Mase, Leonard attended Williams College, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in Music and English. Leonard went on to earn his MM in orchestral conducting at the University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre, and Dance, where he studied with Kenneth Kiesler.

In the summer of 2022, Leonard was selected as a recipient of the American Austrian Foundation/Faber Young Conductors Fellowship at the Salzburg Festival, where he was invited to observe rehearsals of the Vienna Philharmonic, opera productions, and visiting ensembles at the festival. In the summer of 2023, he attended the Tanglewood Music Center Conducting Seminar as well as the Divertimento Ensemble 20th and 21st Century Conducting Course in Moncalvo, Italy.

#### THE RIVERSIDE FOOD PANTRY

The Riverside Food Pantry has been providing meals and groceries for 40 years to members of the West Harlem and Morningside Heights communities. The pandemic and inflation have made the last several years particularly challenging, and the food pantry has experienced a fourfold increase in the number of clients seeking food supplies for their household.

## FIRST SUNDAY FOOD COLLECTION

On first Sundays, if you have a little more to share, consider bringing a few canned goods with you to support the Riverside Food Pantry. There will be a table placed just below the pulpit for your donations. There will also be shopping carts in the narthex (lobby to the nave) as well as a cart near the security desk. You are making it possible for someone to bring home the staples of a meal. Below are some of the items needed:

- Tuna
- Rice
- Canned Ravioli/Spaghetti & Meatballs
- Dry Pasta
- Spaghetti/Tomato Sauce
- Macaroni & Cheese
- Dry Beans (Pinto, Black, White or Kidney)
- Canned Beans (Pinto, Black, White or Kidney)
- Canned Mixed Vegetables
- Individual Sized Apple Sauce/Fruit Cups
- Hot and/or Cold Cereals (oatmeal, Cream of Wheat, Cheerios, Raisin Bran, Corn Flakes)
- Peanut Butter
- Juices (apple, orange, grape or pineapple)
- Baby Foods (assorted)
- Pampers for various ages (newborn toddlers)
