The Reverend Leah D. Jackson, Esq. has been called to minister the Word of God as a preacher, pastor, educator, writer, and dancer. Hale, where she served as the Minister of Christian Education for almost 8 years and is now an Associate Minister. She is currently pursuing her Doctor of Ministry in Preaching at McAfee School of Theology where she serves as the Grant Coordinator for the Reimagining Tomorrow Initiative and is an Adjunct Professor at Spelman College and Lexington Theological Seminary for the CAAM Program.

Rev. Leah received a Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy with a focus in Child Advocacy from Spelman College in 2002; a Juris Doctor from Walter F. Georgia School of Law in 2005; and Master of Divinity from McAfee School of Theology in 2012. She was licensed as a Minister of Dance in 2008 by Dr. Pamela Hardy, the founder and leader of Set Free Evangelistic Ministries. Leah also served as the advisor for the Spelman College Dance Ministry, Movements of Praise, for 5 years.

She serves on the Chaplain Council of the Decatur Alumnae chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., and is the former Chaplain of the Atlanta chapter of the National Alumnae Association of Spelman College. Leah is the 2023 recipient of the prestigious McAfee School of Theology Alumni Create Award. She is the proud author of the devotionals, *Daily Manna from the Psalms: Nuggets of Hope for the Hungry Christian* and *If Perish, I Perish, But I Won't!
