Support Farm Worker's Campaign Against Sexual Violence

Do you know that the tomatoes Wendy's uses on its sandwiches come from farms that don't protect their field workers from sexual violence, don't pay a fair wage, and house their workers in substandard conditions? That's why Riverside's Mission and Social Justice Commission and Church Council endorsed the boycott of Wendy's organized by the Florida-based Coalition of Immokalee Workers (CIW) and their Alliance for Fair Food.

Our church has a strong and growing relationship with these farm workers. We will lodge up to 70 farm workers and their advocates while they are in New York City for their March 11-15 Freedom Fast outside the Park Avenue offices of Wendy's Board Chair Nelson Peltz, and Time's Up Wendy's March on March 15. Their goal: to convince Wendy's to join other major fast food chains and grocery stores to protect farm workers by signing on to the Coalition's Fair Food Program.

You can help support them! Here are four ways:

- 2. Join the fasters during the week at 48th Street and Park Avenue (detailed schedule at boycott-wendys.org/register-fast)
- 3. Join the Time's Up Wendy's March at Dag Hammarskjold Plaza, 245 E. 47th St., at 5 p.m. March 15
- 4. Contribute funds for purchase of electrolyte powder it mixes with water and will help keep the fasters hydrated and healthy




