

A message from Pastor Amy Butler

Dear Riverside,

It's hard to believe, but this June 5th marks the fifth anniversary of you calling me to be your Senior Minister. Some of you know – and many of you don't – so I want to tell you how I met you six years ago. I had been the pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Washington, DC for 11 years. Calvary is a historic congregation as well, one that actually sent a pastor to Riverside before – George Hill who was interim before Bill Coffin came.

When Calvary and I found each other, the church was struggling with conflict and diminished resources; by 2011 we were a thriving community of about 250, diverse and progressive and conflict-free, a picture which didn't always capture the tremendous work and pain it took to arrive at that place. I was in my office at Calvary one day at the end of September in 2013 and I got a call from Brian McLaren, a popular progressive writer and speaker. I was a bit overwhelmed he would be calling me, but when I picked it up he said, "I just left Riverside Church. They are looking for their next pastor and I think you should apply." To make a long story short, your search committee reached out to me and I found out they were looking for a pastor with:

- •A proven track record of institutional renewal, and who was capable and self-reliant enough to make hard decisions that would enable the congregation to have a vibrant and meaningful future.
- •A collaborative leadership style that--in consultation with the congregation-- could shape a vision of that future, rooted in Riverside's heritage of progressive Christianity and its identity as a congregation dedicated to justice and compassion.
- •The ability to attract youth, young adults and young families through exciting new programs and digital media. To be brutally honest, when I confided in close friends that I was considering taking this position, most of them thought I was crazy. And part of me did too. Some of you have been here long enough to remember the years before I came, but many of our new members don't know that Riverside has had its own periods of trial, times that strained and nearly broke the bonds of community. Trust was difficult to come by and in 2014 the scars of trauma, of pain and anger, and disillusionment had only just begun to heal.

A situation like this is a daunting, terrifying space to step in to for any leader. But there was something about you that pulled at my heart. When I met the search committee, I could tell that there were many of you who were deeply committed to being the church and helping Riverside embrace her call in this moment. And, honestly, I wanted to be part of the dream, to take a risk. When my friends and mentors asked me why I decided to take this job, my response was "because I think I can love these people." And that is what I have tried to do, with everything I can bring to the task.

I knew this work would be hard, because I too had been through terrible moments in church, times when community failed me. But I really believe in what God can do through a group of people who really believe, and I felt like there were enough of you who did believe. So, long story short, I took the job. And I risked a lot, and so did you.

- •The number of families and young adults joining the church has increased significantly.
- •We have devised ways to interpret Scripture for the needs of a progressive Christian community far beyond these walls.
- •We have created a well-developed and professional communications program, including effective digital media presence.
- •In 2014 the church was not able to pass a budget, but every year since the process has become better, more transparent, more collaborative, more infused with a spirit of abundance over the fear of scarcity.
- •We have substantially increased restricted and unrestricted gifts every year over the last 5 years. The revenue for 2018 was \$2,195,036.
- •We have reorganized the management structure of the church and attracted some of the most talented leaders in the country to take a risk on our dream as well. Friends, maybe the best gift I have given you and given institutional Christianity as a whole is the professional staff I have hired at all levels.
- Every single one of the programs of the church has been revitalized and are functioning at a higher level.
- Lay leadership across the board is becoming empowered to develop vision for Riverside.
- I have increased collaboration among all programs so that Riverside works together as team and not in silos.
- •We have built community through Sunday Suppers, Pastor's Table, individual meetings between pastors and lay leaders, and Sermon Talk backs, just to name a few. More than this list of achievements, we have been the church, the body of Christ together. We have laughed and cried together. We have shared meals around the table, said goodbye to saints of our community, and celebrated the gift of new life. We have marked the moments of our humanity together in big and small ways and named as holy all our strivings to love God and love each other.

The truth of the matter is that I have pushed you hard these past five years and I will continue to push alongside you because I believe in who we can be. There are things on which I believe we should never compromise: that treating women the same as we treat men is important; that paying for excellent leadership saves us money in the end; that expecting respectful behavior from each other is a baseline; that protecting our institution by insisting on the highest standards of treatment for women and minorities is a necessity; that we will always work to create a healthy and thriving work environment for our staff; that we reflect gospel community in every expression of who we are.

I believe these are your values as well, otherwise I wouldn't be here. The world needs the strong, clear, prophetic voice of The Riverside Church. As our former pastor Bill Coffin liked to say: this world is too dangerous for anything but truth; too small for anything but love.

We have accomplished so much in this time together. I love you and I am deeply grateful for these five years that I've been able to serve as your pastor. Thank you.

an extension of Parish Care Ministry. There are many facets of this ministry, including pastoral care phone calls, notes, and visits; a newly-formed Memory Café, which provides a social, supportive environment for persons with dementia and their care partners; intergenerational opportunities like the Living Lent retreat; and the Business & Professional Women's Group, which will celebrate its 90th anniversary next year of faithfully serving the Riverside community. A pillar of Older Adult Ministry is the Tower League, which was founded in 1960 and given an inspiring mission statement that guides the group today: "The Tower League is a supportive, caring community of older adults. The purpose of the Tower League is to foster fellowship, educational opportunities, social activities, outreach, and spiritual growth for members and friends of The Riverside Church." The Tower League is a participatory community, marked by shared leadership, laughter, openness, and questioning. Tower League is comprised of Riverside participants who gather each week for Bible study, lunch, and a special program. It isn't just a matter of having fun—which, by the way, we have in good supply!—it is about being community with and for one another, and culling and leveraging life experiences in the service of truth-telling, peacemaking, and justice-building. Ageism promotes denigrating stereotypes about old people and old age, pitting generation against generation—which undermines community and the church. Whether studying scripture or enjoying a cabaret show, assembling care packets for college students or learning about the history of jazz, writing poetry or touring the MoMA, the Tower League aims to chart a "more excellent way" by being a supportive, caring community in which varying gifts, abilities, and limits are fully embraced. I'll end this update with just one example of the kinds of rich experiences and insights I have the privilege to witness in this ministry. This poem was written in Tower League, and is published with the poet's permission:

Community Organizing by David Black

I have been your Community Organizer for three months, and I am learning new things about our church every day. Last month I had my most valuable and inspiring lesson so far: when Riversiders say they'll show up, they show up.

In May we organized Riversiders to come to a housing justice assembly to pressure NYC Council Speaker Corey Johnson to commit his support for funding to make essential repairs to families' homes in NYCHA. On Friday evening, after a long week of work, a delegation from our congregation squeezed into a van and rode for almost two hours in rush hour traffic to sing, shout, and stand in

solidarity with our neighbors in public housing. Several more from our congregation joined us there. In all, 16 of you committed to be there, and 17 showed up. In the world of organizing – let alone in the culture of New York City – that level of follow-through is unheard of.

Riverside is a community of people who keep their promises. Because of that, Corey Johnson knows that there is pressure to follow through on the commitments he made to us. Because of that, the residents of NYCHA who have experienced institutional abuse and neglect for decades have had a sliver of dignity restored to them.

That is why Riverside continues to be a force to be reckoned with in the landscape of justice movements in our city. That is why I'm excited and grateful to be with you in this struggle.



CHILDREN'S STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN by Farley Lord

"How do we show love to people we don't know?"

This was the question I posed to the children and adults gathered in Children's Chapel on Sunday, May 19. The particular people we were talking about were the participants of the Coming Home ministry, which provides training, resources, and community for people who have experienced incarceration. In his gentle way, Rev. Kevin Van Hook had introduced the challenges these neighbors face, including the implicit unfairness of our prison system. I offered that giving and serving - prayers, time, metro cards, home-cooked food, and dollar bills - are ways we can show love to the people "coming home."

Riverside's children offer financial gifts every Sunday in their worship. One dollar, quarter, or penny at a time, they have raised \$374 during this program year! From now through June 9 (Bible Sunday and Pentecost), the Stewardship Committee is partnering with Children and Families and Mission and Social Justice to increase the amount raised to \$1,000 and dedicate these funds to the Coming Home ministry. The campaign will continue in Family Worship on June 2, when ministers and lay leaders will engage the children and their parents around the connection between giving and social justice. On June 9, Bible Sunday and Pentecost, Riverside's children will ask the congregation to help them reach their goal. The fundraising results of the campaign will be announced at the Children and Families Cookout on June 16.

Studies resoundingly show that the giving practices of parents and influential adults strongly impact those of their children. Every act of stewardship is a model for children to learn what it means to show love to people - even people we don't know. To join the Riverside Children in showing love to the participants of Coming Home, you can give online by selecting "Coming Home"; or by check or cash by indicating "Coming Home" in the memo line.






