THE LITURGICAL YEAR

The Riverside Church follows the liturgical calendar to mark the seasons of our life together. We are currently in the Season after Pentecost, also known as Ordinary Time. It is signified by the green paraments and clergy stoles that represent new life and growth. Ordinary Time is observed from Pentecost until the beginning of Advent.

In July we will dive into the middle of some of the most beloved gospel passages in Luke's gospel. These weeks will give us the opportunity to hear these words of Jesus again and consider how they're woven together to create a rich and full picture of what he was trying to show his first disciples about what it meant to follow him. The voices of Riverside's pastoral team will weave together to help all of us understand more clearly what these ancient stories mean for our modern context. And all of these threads will find their way into the tapestries of our own lives, creating depth and beauty we might never have anticipated. Join us as we weave together an ancient story and our modern stories, and just watch what beauty emerges.






