A Yale Divinity School graduate, **Erik Kolbell** was the first Minister of Social Justice at Riverside Church in New York City where he worked on fair housing, racial equality, nuclear disarmament, prison reform and other issues. His work took him to Nicaragua as an official U.S. observer for the first democratic elections, to Cuba with *Pastors for Peace* delivering medical supplies, and to South Africa on a fact-finding mission during the apartheid years. As a Congregational minister with a

concentration in Judaic studies, Kolbell has a broad understanding of religious issues and where they intersect with American culture. Prior to his ministry at Riverside Church, Kolbell worked for several years as a college chaplain. His psychotherapy practice incorporates his expertise in family and couples counseling.

He is the author of *The God of Second Chances and Were You There? Finding Ourselves at the Foot of the Cross*. His book, *What Jesus Meant: The Beatitudes and a Meaningful Life*, received a “Best Spiritual Books 2003” from *Spirituality and Health Magazine*. He also authored *Lifescritps for Family and Friends: What to Say in 101 of Life’s Most Troubling and Uncomfortable Situations*, a guidebook for difficult conversations
