

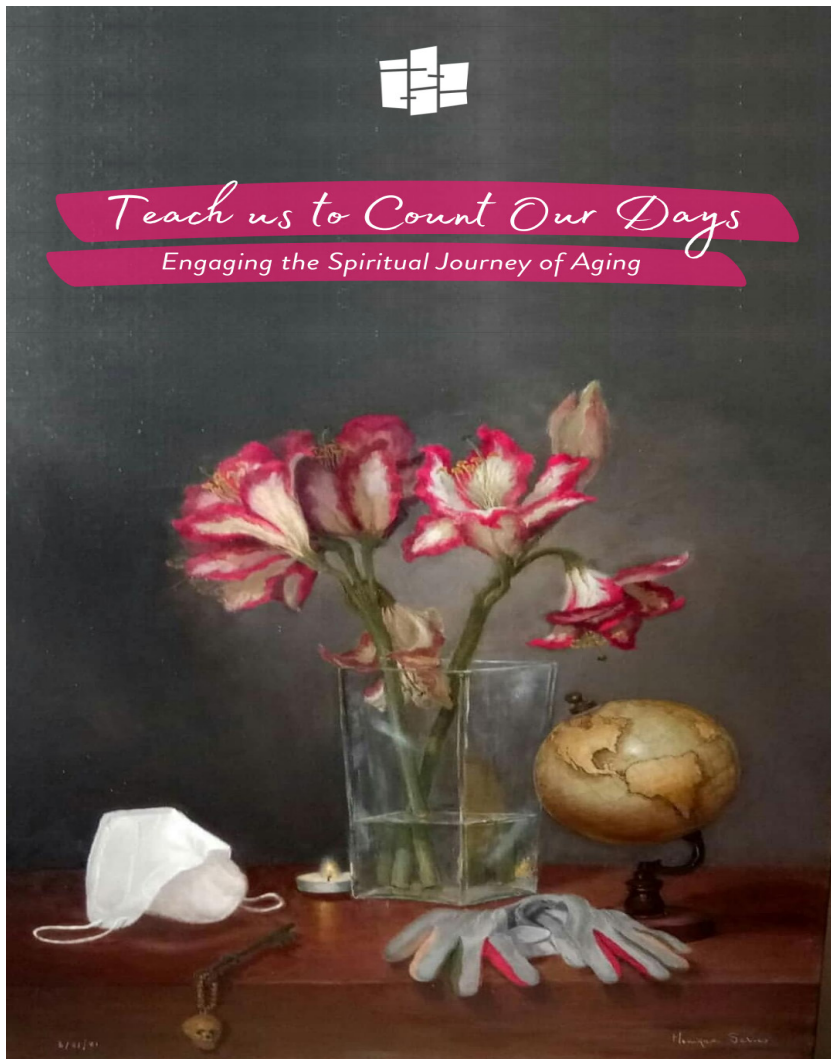

THE LITURGICAL YEAR

The Riverside Church follows the liturgical calendar to mark the seasons of our life together. We are currently in the season of Eastertide, a period of 50 days following the resurrection of Jesus Christ until Pentecost. The liturgical color of Eastertide is white, which symbolizes the hope of the resurrection, as well as the purity and newness that comes from victory over sin and death, as signified by the paraments and clergy stoles.

Help us to create a world where we all can live out our days with respect, security, and dignity. Amen.

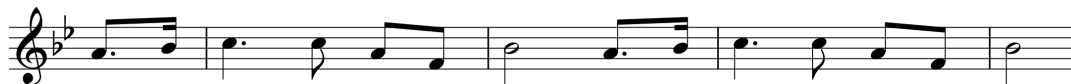

Amy Jill Levine Rabbi Stanley M. Kessler Distinguished Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Hartford International University of Religion and Peace and University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies Emerita and Mary Jane Werthan Professor of Jewish Studies Emerita, at Vanderbilt. Her publications include *The Misunderstood Jew: The Church and the Scandal of the Jewish Jesus*, *Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi*; six children's books (with Sandy Sasso); *The Gospel of Luke* (with Ben Witherington III, the first biblical commentary by a Jew and an Evangelical); *The Jewish Annotated New Testament* (co-edited with Marc Brettler), *The Bible With and Without Jesus: How Jews and Christians Read the Same Stories Differently* (with Marc Brettler), *The Pharisees* (co-edited with Joseph Sievers), and thirteen edited volumes of the *Feminist Companions to the New Testament and Early Christian Literature*. Along with Introduction to the Old Testament for the Teaching Company, her study guides include *Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven*; *Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent*, *The Difficult Words of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to His Most Perplexing Teachings*, and *Witness at the Cross: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week*. The first Jew to teach New Testament at Rome's Pontifical Biblical Institute, and an elected member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, AJ describes herself as an unorthodox member of an Orthodox synagogue and a Yankee Jewish feminist who seeks to correct anti-Jewish, sexist, and other harmful interpretations of the Bible.



Painter Monique Serres is an active member of The Riverside Church, including the Tower League. Monique joined the church in 1990, but has been involved since 1971. A native of Port-au-Prince, Monique is a graduate of Fashion Institute of Technology (Textile Design, Interior Design) and a life-member of the Art Students League. Her work has been exhibited in museums and galleries both in New York City and internationally, including West Side Arts Coalition, Cork gallery Lincoln Center, Hudson Guild Gallery, Marina Tsevetseva Museum, Moscow, Russia; Royal Canberra Show, Australia. The featured image in Riverside's Older Adult Series is Monique's "Still life on the pandemic," which speaks to the fragility and sacredness of life and the need to love and protect our neighbors during the pandemic.
