Inspired by General Order No. 3, the 1865 announcement of the emancipation of enslaved people in Galveston, Texas.

"The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and hired labor. The freedmen are advised to remain quietly at their present homes and work for wages. They are informed that they will not be allowed to collect at military posts and that they will not be supported in idleness either there or elsewhere."

ABOUT OUR GUEST PREACHER

Rev. Dr. Adolphus C. Lacey



The eleventh Pastor of the history-making Bethany Baptist Church of Brooklyn, New York, the Reverend Dr. Adolphus C. Lacey is a native of Kansas City, KS. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in World History degree from Ottawa University, a Master of Divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary, and a Doctor of Philosophy degree from Northwestern University. He also holds a certificate from the Harvard University Divinity School's Institute for Church-based Community and Economic Development.

Dr. Lacey began his career in ministry as Youth Minister and then Associate Pastor of Christian Education and Discipleship at Grace Baptist

Church in Mt. Vernon, NY, under the leadership of Rev. Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson, where he managed Grace Community Development Corporation, a not-for-profit interfaith social service agency, coupling Christian nurture with his extensive community development experience. He then served successfully as senior pastor of Mount Olivet Baptist Church in Peekskill, NY, where he created several ministries to support the diverse needs of the congregation and the Westchester community at large.

Dr. Lacey is a pastor-theologian-activist. He serves as spiritual advisor to Until Freedom, Inc., president of the Central Brooklyn Chapter of the National Action Network, co-convener of East Brooklyn Congregations, trustee of New York Theological Seminary, and member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. Believing in the equality of gifting, Dr. Lacey affirmed the need for gender-inclusive ministries. He ordained the first female minister in the long-storied history of the Bethany Baptist Church in 2016 and in 2017 he integrated the diaconate by ordaining eight female deacons.

Dr. Lacey goes beyond the walls of the church in his efforts. He has served as an adjunct professor in the Philosophy and Religious Studies Department at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, NY, and conducts workshops. He had the privilege of offering the opening prayer for the 110th Congress of the U.S. House of Representatives in 2008, offering the opening prayer for the 118th Congress of the U.S. Senate, and participating in an ecumenical prayer service with His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI.

Dr. Lacey was honored for his work and dedication by the Samuel Dewitt Procter Institute, which invited him to deliver a sermon in their renowned "Great Preacher Series" in 2010. In 2013, he was inducted into the Board of Preachers at Morehouse College, and in 2016, KCK Public Schools recognized him as a "Reason to Believe." Additionally, the National Action Network honored him with the Rev. Dr. William A. Jones Award for Social Justice in both 2016 and 2018.

Dr. Lacey is not only an intergenerational pastor, professor, and community leader, but also cherishes his role as the husband of Cheryl Mathews Lacey and the father of Cameryn Alexandra and Adolphus Matthew, two exceptional children.
